Postponement of IOGOOS integrated meetings due to COVID-19

Indian Ocean Global Ocean Observing System (IOGOOS) is a GOOS Regional Alliance for Indian Ocean, formed to tackle the common issues in the region and to address the limitations of individual member institutes in a collaborative manner and through sustained observations and collaborative research. All 28 Marine Institutions from 17 Indian Ocean rim-countries viz. Australia, Bangladesh, France, India, Indonesia, Iran, Kenya, Kuwait, Reunion, Madagascar, Maldives, Mauritius, Mozambique, South Africa, Sri Lanka and Tanzania as well as the NOAA Office of Global Programmes and IOC's Perth Regional Programme Office, who are members of the IOGOOS meet annually for developing programmes for the implementation of GOOS and for promoting activities of common interest for the development of operational oceanography in the Indian Ocean region.

This year, the meeting of IOGOOS was scheduled to be held together with the meetings of the Indian Ocean Regional Panel (IORP), Sustained Indian Ocean Biogeochemistry and Ecosystem Research (SIBER), Indian Ocean Observing System (IndOOS) Resource Forum (IRF) and the Steering Committee of the International Indian Ocean Expedition (IIOE)-2 in Goa, India during March 22 – 26, 2020. These integrated meetings were planned to be held immediately after the International Indian Ocean Science Conference 2020 (IIOSC 2020) during March 16-20, 2020.

Unfortunately however, outbreak of the infectious disease COVID-19 caused by a newly discovered Corona virus, and its spread across several countries caused major distress among several national and international registered participants of the IIOSC-2020 as well as the integrated meetings of IOGOOS. Keeping in view the safety and health concerns of the delegates and the health advisories issued by several countries, the International Indian Ocean Science Conference 2020 and the integrated meetings of IOGOOS and its allied projects postponed till further notice. After revisiting the situation on COVID-19 and after due consultation with all concerned leaders of these groups, new dates, later in 2020, will be announced.

To keep the spirit of interest of these experts working in the Indian Ocean, it has been proposed that individual groups may schedule interim meetings through internet based electronic conference /other media facilities. IOGOOS requests all the readers to stay safe and healthy.

Tutorial Capacity Building in the 15th Pan Ocean Remote Sensing Conference(PORSEC) 15-19 September, 2020

The PORSEC Association would like to invite you to participate in the upcoming Tutorial Capacity Building in conjunction with the PORSEC 2020 conference from 15th to 19th September, 2020 which will be held at Faculty of Built Environment and Surveying, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, Johor Bahru, Malaysia. The five-day tutorial offers expert training for students and young scientists. The tutorial would focus on existing instruments in space and on methods of analysis and visualization. One of the unique aspects of the PORSEC tutorial is that most of the instructors are current or past PORSEC officers, who are experienced remote sensing scientists, which would give the participants a valuable networking experience, in addition to the knowledge and skills taught during the tutorial. Participants will be given exposure in the following areas.

- Fundamentals of visible, thermal and microwave remote sensing, satellite wind and wave data, satellite altimetry, ocean color data, fisheries applications, and data assimilation.
- Demonstrations on how to access all of these datasets from a variety of different software.
- How to write scientific manuscript
- *Giving a scientific presentation in English to an international audience.*
- Experience live field data collection and sampling at the ocean facilitated by the experienced local facilitators.
- Related instruments used for ocean water sampling would be demonstrated and students will get
- opportunities to operate them.


POSTPONEMENT of International Indian Ocean Science Conference-2020
